Greetings!

In a little over a week we will move into the liturgical season of Lent. We begin the Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday with a service of dust and ashes, symbolizing our human mortality and our sinful nature. We reflect on what separates us from God as we look both inward and outward to weigh the cost of discipleship. It is a time when we commit to practices such as prayer and Scripture meditation, moral inventory, and fasting - as well as acts of generosity and service. This is a wonderful time for baptism and reaffirming our own baptismal promises. We make this journey as individuals and as a community. Have you thought about what practice you might engage during these six weeks?

I am a person who is usually reading several books at a time. I read one about theology, one about church history or current trends, one about spirituality and one from another discipline. My reading also includes the Scriptures, both for sermon preparation and for personal spiritual formation. If you have been in our worship services over the last few weeks, you know I have been asking all of you to read the Bible as a consistent discipline. So, this is what I am doing as my Lenten practice. I am going to fast from books! I am only going to read the Bible, no other books. "No books, just the Bible!" So how will I do it? Will I read chronologically, from Genesis to Deuteronomy (The Pentateuch), or start with the Gospels (Mathew, Mark, Luke and John)? I'm still pondering and am open to your suggestions.

There was a day in 1994 when I made a commitment to God to become a radical disciple. For me, this meant to be radically available whenever, however, wherever God chose to use me. It meant listening and discerning the living word of God. My personal mission has been to know God and to make God know. Almost seventeen years later, I believe I know God better and I pray that in some way my life or ministry point others to God, that they might know God better. God reveals Himself in the living Word! To delve into the Word of God is to meet God through the power of the Holy Spirit.

There are many ways to study the Scriptures. Here are a few recommendations:

Begin with prayer.

Identify the type of literature it is; historical, biographical, poetic, proverbial, prophetic, a letter.  
Ask these questions; who, what, when, where, why and how.  
Identify the context by identifying facts, people and events.  
Look for key words.  
Identify key themes.  
Pray to God for wisdom to discern how you might apply God's word to your own life.

I encourage you to get into the Word by yourself or get into a small group and begin to study the Bible together. I always learn more through both study and conversation. Everyone has a piece of the wisdom. There will be several opportunities for you during the Lenten season. I pray that we will all grow in knowledge and wisdom. Let me know if you have other ways to study and let's keep talking.

Starting with our Ash Wednesday service on March 9 at 7:00 we enter a new liturgical season, when we begin to examine ourselves, to admit to God our place and patterns of sin and to work at changing these with God's help. I pray we can take this journey together.

I again want to remind all members of the congregation that you are welcome to attend our Council meetings on the 4th Monday of each month beginning at 7:00. This year we are meeting in the chapel. In her message Sunday, Pastor Connie mentioned the opportunity we have as a church to engage in meaningful relationships with the staff and students at Baker University. One of the ways this is already being accomplished is our church being responsible for providing the meals for staff and students following the worship services at Osborne Chapel on Thursday mornings. Here is a ministry that you don't have to travel to some distant location or some foreign country to be a part of. And we certainly can use your help. We still need more folks to help prepare meals to serve about 50 people each week. These meals could consist of soup or chili along with a salad; some sandwiches and chips; any other meal that would be easy and inexpensive to prepare to serve about 50 people. Table service, drinks and dessert are provided through other sources. An alternative way of helping would be to contribute toward the cost of a meal as we often purchase pizza, deli sandwiches or meals from the cafeteria in the union. Any amount would be appreciated. Your checks can be made out to Baker University and would be tax deductible. You can give me your check or take it to Ira's office in the basement of Osborne Chapel. If you have any questions about this ministry, please don't hesitate to talk to me about it. I hope you will consider reaching out to our neighbors across the street in offering a helping hand. **\*Safe and Sacred Spaces Training:** The Kansas East Conference of the United Methodist Church requires that any adult (ages 18 and up) who works with children and/or youth complete a sexual abuse prevention program titled Safe and Sacred Spaces. There will be a Safe and Sacred Spaces training on **Saturday, March 12th, from 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in the church library.** Participants will need to download training forms and the training workbook at the Kansas East website ([kansaseast.org](http://kansaseast.org)). Simply click on the Safe and Sacred Spaces link on the left hand side of the page and it will take you to the Safe and Sacred Spaces page. The cost of the training is \$30 and participants need to come with all forms completed. Please be sure to make a copy of the forms for your own records, as well. Safe and Sacred Spaces Certification is good for 5 yrs. Thank you for helping us make sure that BFUMC is a safe place for kids and youth to learn about God and Jesus!

**\*Save the date:** Summer seems far away during these cold winter months, but it will arrive sooner than we think. We are already thinking about Vacation Bible School! Please save the dates of July 11-14 because Pandamania VBS is coming to town!! Beginning at 6:30 p.m. and ending at 9:00 p.m, kids will learn through Psalm 139 that God is WILD about them!

Last year, we ministered to 125 kids during our 5 day VBS! This year, our prayer goal is 150! To do this, we need lots of ministry partners. How can YOU be a ministry partner? We need loving adults and youth to help and assist at activity stations. We also need adults and youth to act as walking leaders. If you cannot physically be present at VBS, maybe you would like to financially support VBS. And one of the best ways you can support our VBS is through your prayers. **\*Nursery:** Baldwin FUMC offers nursery services each Sunday morning beginning at 9:15 a.m. and ending at the end of our morning worship service (roughly 12:00 p.m.). Our nursery is located in the basement level of the church and can be found under the stairs that lead to the first floor. We provide nursery for children ages infant through 3 years old. Our nursery is staffed by 2 paid attendants each Sunday morning (all are Baker University students) and all of our nursery staff have received Safe and Sacred Space Training (an abuse prevention program through the Kansas East Conference of the United Methodist Church), as well as having passed criminal background checks. We strive to provide a safe and loving space for our youngest congregants.

**\*Sunday School:** Our Sunday School classes begin at 9:30 a.m. The Children's Ministry at BFUMC offers Sunday School for toddlers through grade 5. Children ages preschool through 3rd grade gather at 9:30 in the Chapel for a 15 minute opening time of singing, visiting, and praying, after which they are dismissed to their teachers for the remaining Sunday School hour. Toddlers, 4th, and 5th graders report directly to their classrooms at 9:30. Sunday School dismisses at 10:30 a.m. We ask that parents please pick up toddlers through 1st grade students directly from their child's classroom. 2nd grade through 5th grade students are dismissed from their classrooms and instructed to meet up with their parents in the church Chapel.

\*Baldwin FUMC strives to create a safe and sacred environment in which children can learn about God and His great love for them. Teachers working with children and youth have completed Safe and Sacred Space training and have passed criminal background checks. We strive to have 2 adult teachers in the Sunday School classroom each Sunday. Below is a list of our Sunday School classes, the location of the classroom, and their teachers. *TO SAVE A LIFE is the story of all-American teen Jake Taylor, who seems to have it all. But after a childhood friend's death, Jake's world turns upside down, and he is forced to make a decision that could change his life forever. TO SAVE A LIFE is about making unexpected choices and sacrifices, while having the courage and determination to persevere against all odds.*

Last year our small community was devastated by three suicides within a short period of time. We all struggled with putting understanding on the devastation. Our youth want to come together to help us learn to understand and heal... this film can be a starting point for that on-going, open communication.

At some point, every teen has to decide: "What's my life going to be about?" *TO SAVE A LIFE* dares to bring that question into their world, encouraging them to answer it with boldness, honesty and compassion.

*TO SAVE A LIFE* has started a movement across the country. In communities just like ours, groups are working together to make an organized effort to reach local teens in crisis. Groups like ours are dedicated to offering every teen the opportunity to see this film and hear its powerful message of hope. **Will you please join us? Simply come to the movie night and encourage teenagers and parents to come too.**

In response to the movie's tough topics (*social division, school violence, cutting, suicide, teen pregnancy, alcohol use, and divorce*), we will have a time of small-group discussion directly following the movie for all who want to participate. Helping professionals will be available for those who may be dealing with some of these issues and need to talk. For more in-depth follow up, beginning on Sunday, April 10 the CROSS Culture Youth Group (which is open to every teenager in town) will be hosting a weekly To Save A Life series. All high school teens are invited to come be a part of this powerful learning experience.
