I hope and trust that everyone was as uplifted during our Advent and Christmas seasons as I was. What a wonderful time of praying, listening, decorating, singing, playing, and experiencing once again the anticipation and celebration of the birth of Emmanuel, God-with-us, Jesus of Nazareth, the Christ.

This church is wonderfully blessed with talented and remarkable musicians who are able to play, sing, dance and communicate the musical message in such uplifting ways. My thanks goes to the all of them for their extra work. It was appreciated!

When I asked this question of someone the other day, the answer seemed to both of us to be "yes". Does it seem that January is the fastest month of the year? I know others seem fast as well, but January always seems to fly by us. All the things that I put off in December to do later are still there waiting to be done. And that month goes fast. Here we are to February already.

Debbie and I are now moved to the new parsonage. That move took place in the latter part of January (adding to the list of things needing to be done). We thank you all for your approval of the purchase of that house, to the Trustees for their work in making the purchase and in making improvements to the house, to the crew who helped us move, and to all who helped in other ways, including providing food. We thank you and we appreciate it very much.

I am pleased to let you know that at the January meeting of our Church Council, approval was given to an *Adult Education and Ministries Council*. I am aware that such a thing has been discussed for some time and now it is here. This church is also wonderfully blessed to have strong children's and youth ministries. Structure was needed for adult ministries as well.

This *Council* will have these responsibilities: organizing and supervising all adult Christian education matters, including starting classes or programs and use of material, literature or media; encouraging adults of all ages to participate in the Sunday morning Christian Education program of the church as well as other Christian Education programs; encouraging the use of United Methodist materials, literature and media; organizing, planning and implementing local mission education tours of United Methodist ministries; encouraging adults to be involved in the overall life of the church and faith; and, instructing adults in the use of John Wesley's theological guidelines (the "quadrilateral"), and using it in practice and decision making.

Look for this *Council* to be formed and begin their work soon.

Though, as noted, we only recently completed the Advent and Christmas seasons, the season of *Lent* begins this month, on February 22, Ash Wednesday.

"Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lencten, which means "spring." The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time for penance by all Christians. The First Sunday describes Jesus' temptation by Satan; and the Sixth Sunday (Passion/Palm Sunday), Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and his subsequent passion and death. Because Sundays are always little Easters, the penitential spirit of Lent should be tempered with joyful expectation of the Resurrection. (from THE UNITED METHODIST BOOK OF WORSHIP)."

And, *"Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: we confront our own mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith. . . . The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship, and the Imposition of Ashes can be a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. This practice is the historic focus of Ash Wednesday observance and gave the day its name. It is traditional to save the palm branches from the previous Passion/Palm Sunday service and burn them ahead of time to produce the ashes for this service. (also from THE UNITED METHODIST BOOK OF WORSHIP)."*

We will begin this penitential season with such a worship service at 7 o'clock that night. The Baker University Minister, Rev. Dr. Ira DeSpain and I will lead this service. We will have music from the Baker Community Choir, the Baker University Chamber Choir, singing of traditional hymns appropriate for the day, and the imposition of ashes.

I hope you will plan to be present for this worship service.

I also invite you to a Lenten weekday Bible study during the season. I will be teaching this class on Thursdays. I'll tell you more later.

I pray for you a blessed and meaningful season of Lent.

END OF 2001 FINANCE REPORT

I am happy to report that Baldwin First United Methodist Church finished the year \$322 in the black. Thank you to all those people who contributed to help us make our budget last year. This is the third year in a row that we have finished the year with a positive balance.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that we increased our 2012 budget by \$17,000. This is a huge leap of faith since our pledges from the stewardship campaign were only for about 55% of the new budget. You can keep track of where we stand financially on a monthly basis on the bulletin board in the basement beside the east door. Three charts are displayed there showing our financial situation in giving, expenses and how we compare to our yearly budget. Stop by and take a look. The next financial report will be in the VINE at the end of the first quarter in April.
